

## *Questions for Students*

### *Issues Related to Organization*

1. How do you think this school wants you to know, understand, and be able to do after you graduate?
2. Does the school function in an organized way?
3. What activities does the school offer to make it more fun or interesting to be a student here?
4. Are your parents involved in the school in any way? On a committee? Come to school as a volunteer? Work here? What about other adults? Business men and women?

### *Issues Related to Curriculum*

1. Do teachers clearly communicate their expectations to you?
2. Do you receive a course outline or syllabus at the start of each school year?

### *Issues Related to Instruction*

1. Are your teachers clear about the content they expect you to learn? What happens if you're having difficulty?
2. Is school challenging? Interesting? Too hard? Too easy?
3. Do you ever do projects or presentations, work in groups, have guest speakers, or take field trips?
4. Talk about homework.

### *Issues Related to Assessment*

1. How do you find out how well you're doing in a class? What your grade is? Do you learn this early enough to improve?
2. Can you get extra help if you're having difficulty?

### *Issues Related to Culture and Support*

1. Is the school safe, clean, and orderly? Are the rules understood and enforced fairly?
2. Does the school encourage diversity and multiculturalism?
3. Tell us about how this school recognizes student accomplishments? Academic; athletic; artistic; community service; work preparation; other?
4. Does the school offer any help for you if you're having difficulty academically? Personally?
